DIRECTORS' REPORT

Report of the Directors to the Members at the Ordinary General Meeting to be held in Sydney on 24th June, 1968.

Your directors have pleasure in presenting their report for the year ended 31st December, 1967. This proved to be a year in which the reputation of the Trust was further enhanced not only at home but also in international circles.

In the international sphere The Australian Ballet made its second overseas tour when it visited New Zealand, Hawaii, Canada—as a notable part of Australia's contribution to the World Exposition in Montreal—the Caribbean and Latin America. Its performances throughout the tour were accorded a resounding welcome. The Marionette Theatre of Australia made a tour of Asian countries where it was warmly received. After so many years of one-way cultural traffic it is pleasing to note that Australian companies have now achieved international stature. The standards reached at home in both opera and drama also confirmed to Australian audiences the continuing advances in the quality of the performing arts.

The Balance Sheet and Statement of Income and Expenditure of the Trust for the twelve months ended 31st December, 1967, have been duly audited by Messrs, G. T. Hartigan and Co. Income from all sources other than box-office receipts amounted to \$1,300,505 and net expenditure \$1,236,370. The surplus for the year, \$64,135, has been transferred to the Trust's accumulated funds, which now stand at \$197,448.

Gross income, including all box-office receipts, amounted to \$2,567,968 and gross expenditure was \$2,503,833. An amount of \$20,995 has been provided in this year's accounts for doubtful debts. It has been necessary to write off debts totalling \$18,869 and thus, after including the previous year's provision of \$19,874, there remains \$22,000 to carry forward. This amount should be adequate to cover any further losses in this regard.

During the year increased support was received from the Commonwealth Government and the State Government of New South Wales to enable the establishment of a permanent theatre orchestra for the opera and ballet companies, and to allow for a permanent nucleus of the opera company to be maintained. Other States also made significant grants to the Trust's activities.

The magnitude of the support for the Trust by all governments and their willingness to maintain increasing support, reflect the fruition of many years of endeavour and artistic achievement since the Trust was first established. For much of the vision and for a great measure of the fulfilment of that vision, the Trust and the community generally are indebted to Dr. H. C. Coombs, who was the Trust's Chairman throughout the year under review, but who relinquished this position early in 1968, following his appointment as Chairman of the newly established Australian Council for the Arts.

To this new and challenging responsibility Dr. Coombs carries the admiration, confidence and goodwill of all at the Trust, who over the years have found constant inspiration in his leadership. Your directors have unanimously agreed that Dr. Coombs should be awarded honorary Life Membership of the Trust, and that his name should be perpetuated by the Trust in an appropriate fashion.

As a result of Dr. Coombs' retirement, a reorganisation of the Board structure has been necessary, and the following changes have been effected:

- (a) Sir Ian Potter, formerly President of the Trust, has accepted the office of Chairman of the Board.
- (b) Colonel Aubrey H. L. Gibson has been appointed President of the Trust to succeed Sir Ian Potter,
- (c) The Executive Committee of the Board has been re-constituted to include Directors who have accepted particular responsibilities in specific areas of the Trust's work. In addition to the President and the Chairman, these directors are Mr. C. Alcorso, Sir Robert Madgwick, Messrs. N. R. Seddon and M. C. Timbs,

The Board regrets to report the death of Mr. L. C. Waterman, who had been a Director and loyal supporter of the Trust since its establishment,

The opportunity is taken by the Board to express its appreciation to the Executive and staff of the Trust for their continued loyalty, resource and sustained effort,

In accordance with the Companies Ordinance, 1962, as amended, the Directors report as follows:

- 1. The results for the year under review have not been affected by items of an abnormal character other than as mentioned in the accounts and in this report.
- No circumstances have arisen which render adherence to the existing method of valuation of assets or liabilities of the Company misleading or inappropriate.
- 3. No contingent liabilities have been undertaken by the Company since the end of the period covered by the last report and no contingent liability has become enforceable or is likely to become enforceable within the succeeding period of twelve months which will materially affect the Company in its ability to meet its obligations as and when they fall due.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

The Trust's busy schedule of work in 1967 featured several major additions to its already broad area of responsibility. Notable among these additions was the creation of the Trust Theatre Orchestra, which began its career at the beginning of May and has since worked continuously for the Trust seasons of opera and ballet, besides including three concert performances (two in Sydney, one in Orange, N.S.W.) in its exceptionally wide range of first-year obligations. The creation of this orchestra was made possible by special grants from the Commonwealth and New South Wales Governments.

The two major Trust organisations—the Elizabethan Trust Opera Company and The Australian Ballet—have greatly benefited from increased audience support during 1967 stimulated by the introduction of the subscription principle at the box-office, an innovation which proved successful beyond all expectations. In the first year of its application to opera, for instance, this principle won 31,000 subscribers in Adelaide, Brisbane, Canberra, Melbourne and Sydney—and in the case of Sydney, the demand exceeded the accommodation of the theatre. The introduction of the Trust's new subscription selling has materially contributed to the elimination of many of the former uncertainties of the box-office.

The Elizabethan Trust Opera Company's operation was further strengthened during the year by a special contribution from the New South Wales Government to enable it to maintain a permanent nucleus of artists throughout the year. The Australian Ballet undertook its second overseas tour in 1967 with performances in Canada, which climaxed in performances in Montreal for Expo '67, and in Latin America. Jamaica, Trinidad, Brazil, Argentina, Chile, Peru, Colombia and Mexico were the countries toured following the Expo '67 engagements.

Early in the year, Peter Scriven's "Tintookies" completed their Asian tour, sponsored by the Australian Department of External Affairs. Twelve different countries were visited during this tour, during which puppet performances were given to more than 100,000 persons, including a number of Heads of State, their wives and families. Gratitude is expressed for the support which the "Tintookies" enjoy from Ampol Petroleum Limited and the Bank of New South Wales.

One of the most pleasing occurrences during the year was the decision of the Melbourne City Council to make an annual grant to the Union Theatre Repertory Company in recognition of that company's work over the years. A bequest to the Trust by the late Mrs. Lilian May Jones, an award from the Myer Foundation and a loan from the Victorian Government together enabled this company to replan its entire scale of operation. Closing its doors in December, the company undertook complete renovation of its theatre in Russell Street, to a design by Robin Boyd, and was thus in readiness to emerge in 1968 under its new name—The Melbourne Theatre Company.

Drama in Sydney also enjoyed financial benefits through the New South Wales Government's newly created Cultural Grants Advisory Committee and through the Gulbenkian Foundation, which made a grant to the University of New South Wales Drama Foundation for a season of Australian plays.

The Australian Ballet and The Australian Ballet School have now occupied the newly renovated premises so generously provided by the Melbourne City Council at Debney's Paddock, Flemington Bridge.

During the year the Trust was associated in television presentations of its opera and ballet companies, a phase of our work which we believe will become increasingly important.

A most notable development in the year was the Federal Government's announcement of the creation of a Council for the Arts under the chairmanship of Dr. H. C. Coombs. This decision, arising out of Trust recommendations to the Government in the previous year, is an important step in the implementation of the principle of co-ordinated Federal support for the performing arts on a continuous basis.

It has became usual to end an annual report with personal tributes to the staff in the many Trust departments for their year's work. Such recognition may sometimes seem to be no more than the perfunctory exercise of a settled habit—which, for so many dedicated individuals who put their task before all else, would be most unfortunate,

The total income for 1967 shows an apparent reduction from 1966, which has been brought about by the extended overseas tours in 1967 by The Australian Ballet and The Marionette Theatre. Box office receipts, subsidies from governments and gross expenditure for these tours do not appear in the above figures. However, the Trust's contributions of \$34,000 and \$3,217 for the overseas tours by The Australian Ballet and The Marionette Theatre respectively are included in the expenditure for those activities.

Also reflected in the lower box office figures is the restriction by the Trust of its participation in Australian tours by

overseas companies.

Nevertheless, the comparative statement which follows shows a significant increase in public response in 1967, both in attendances and box office receipts. The success of the subscription system of ticket selling is reflected in these figures and it is especially pleasing to report the substantial increase in attendances at Opera and Ballet performances by youth subscribers.

The increased subsidy from the Commonwealth Government in 1967, included additional funds to cover rising costs and the maintenance of the permanent Theatre Orchestra, which was established in May, 1967. The increased subsidies from state governments included substantial assistance from the Government of New South Wales towards the maintenance of both the permanent Orchestra and the permanent nucleus of the Opera Company. The Government of Tasmania increased its general grant by \$2,000, and the Cultural Grants Advisory Committee of New South Wales increased its allocation for assistance provided through the Trust by \$2,000.
