MARIONETTES MOUNT NEW PRODUCTION

The Sydney Opera House Recording Hall will be the venue for the Marionette Theatre of Australia's next presentation to be premiered during the May school holidays. "Whacko the Diddle-O! (A Funny Kind of Puppet Show)" is made up of short plays in which things don't always turn out as expected! Devised by Richard Bradshaw it is presented in the black theatre style and is a lot of fun. The show commences with a number of "fractured" nursery rhymes and a "silent movie" item entitled THE TRAMP and is followed by a play especially created for Marionette Theatre by visiting American puppeteer Steve Hansen. Steven Hansen was invited to Australia by the Adelaide Festival where he performed his ingenious one man walking puppet show. His production for the Marionettes is called JACK AND THE BEANSTALK THAT CON-QUERED THE WORLD and is a spoof on all those Hollywood monster movies as Jack creates a giant beanstalk which tries to take over Sydney.

Whacko the Diddle-O! (A Funny Kind of Puppet Show) will be presented in the Recording Hall from May 9 to 21 playing Tuesday — Friday at 11 a.m. and 2 p.m. and Saturday and Sunday at 2 p.m. Trust Members receive a 50c concession on adult tickets and can purchase tickets at the Opera House and agencies on production of your membership cards.

KOREAN DANCER TO TOUR

The highly talented Korean dancer, Won-Kyung Cho will visit Australia in early May to present his one man show. At once a dancer, actor and musician Won-Kyung Cho has an impressive background. He taught dance and literature at the universities of Yonsei and Seoul before leaving for the United States in 1960 where he studied at the Juilliard School of Music and the Martha Graham School of Contemporary Dance. In the United States he obtained his doctorate in fine arts and is a regular guest lecturer at American universities. He has published two books on Korean dance and culture.

Won-Kyung Cho's performance creates an anthology of Korean tradition and as is the Korean custom he plays both female and male roles. His performance is a long and intense recreation of the past, depicting through customs — royal and folkloric, religious and rustic — a life punctuated with ceremonies celebrated through music and dance: dances of the Court, of Confucius, of Buddha, of rice-planting, of the abandoned girl or of valiant battles.

After a performance in Cleveland, Ohio last year he was described as "a master beyond refute. He performed as a vessel for a force far greater than himself. In his immersion into the character of dance, he brought to life the tradition of an entire culture."

Won-Kyung Cho will appear at the Recording Hall, Sydney Opera House on Friday May 5th and at the Canberra Playhouse on Saturday May 6th. Trust Members receive a \$1.00 concession at both centres and may purchase tickets from the theatre or agencies on presentation of membership cards.

THE WILD GIRL IN THE HEART is a collection of poems by Australian writers set to music by Robyn Archer. It's language was recently described as "offensive" by a distribution company who refused to handle its re-

lease but it has been sold out at all available outlets.

THE PARIS COMPANY ARRIVES

You may have read in the press that some of Sydney's leading actors and directors have joined together to form a new theatre company in which they the artists will share the responsibility for managing the company. Called the Paris Company after their home, the Paris Theatre in Liverpool Street, Darlinghurst (which was designed by Walter Burley Griffin shortly after his arrival in Australia in 1913). they open with their first production on June 15th. PANDORA'S CROSS is a musical play by Dorothy Hewett which weaves together incidents and people from Kings Cross' chequered history - the dramas and scandals that have brought it notoriety. Productions planned for later this year include Melbourne writer Louis Nowra's VISIONS and Patrick White's A CHEERY SOUL.

The company includes actors Jennifer Claire, Arthur Dignam, Robyn Nevin, John Redfern, Julie McGregor and Bryan Brown with directors Rex Cramphorn and Jim Sharman. As a mark of their enthusiasm and support the company are foregoing wages during the rehearsal period and will work for a minimum wage during the run. Still finance is tight so they are entirely dependent on you the audience to provide your support to keep the theatre going. Bookings can be made on 619.193 from mid-May. Members receive a \$1.00 concession on the A Reserve price.

UNDER THE MICROSCOPE

THE AUSTRALIAN MUSIC CENTRE

(An occasional series on arts organisations whose activities may be unfamiliar to many Members.)

The Australian Music Centre in the Rocks is the resource centre for music in Australia. It has a free library of Australian music, books, records, tapes and periodicals; listening facilities; an information service; press cutting file; photocopying facilities and space for music organisations to meet. In addition the Centre frequently presents concerts, lectures, exhibitions and workshops.

Although the Centre's offices are only open from Monday to Friday on any weekend stroll through the Rocks area you might find the Centre host to a recital of Australian songs, a jazz concert, a lute recital, Turkish saz music, a folk marathon or a brass band workshop. The Boite, Australia's first multiethnic centre for music and poetry, takes place every

other Friday and has presented performances ranging from a Ukrainian bandura ensemble to Greek Shadow Puppets.

The Music Centre's programme for early May includes Indian music and dance, Australian choral works, an early music recital, lectures by composer and ethnomusicologist Dr. Dale Craig, a concert of contemporary Australian and Japanese music, and a special Sydney performance of the Australian Performing Group's Back to Bourke St. fresh from the Adelaide Festival.

Visitors are always welcome at the Centre so next time you're in the Rocks (the Centre is on the 2nd floor, 80 George St) do pop in to see what's happening. And if you would like to receive advance notice of concerts and other activities ring the Centre on 27 1001 to have your name added to the mailing list — there is no charge for this service.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

The Annual General Meeting of the Australian Elizabethan Theatre Trust will take place on Monday June 26th at 5.30 p.m. in the Trust offices, Kings Cross. It will be followed at 6.30 p.m. by a reception at which Members will have the opportunity of talking with Trust Governors, Directors, members of staff and of course other Members. The AGM is a valuable opportunity for Members to learn of the development of their Theatre Trust and we hope that many of you will be able to attend. Those of you who are unable to be at the meeting will be very welcome, along with any guests you wish to bring, at the reception. We will be asking you to advise us if you will be attending in the next Trust News but in the meantime make a note of the date now!

THE BENNELONG PROGRAMME

During the next six months the Opera House will play host to a number of exciting programmes designed to increase your knowledge of the arts and your awareness of the way that performances are developed and put together. The areas to be covered include ballet, dance, opera, drama music (jazz, chamber and orchestral) puppets and film and each of the daytime programmes costs \$1.50 and lasts for between 60 and 90 minutes. The programme commences on May 11 with INSIDE OPERA presented by the Australian Opera and this is followed on May 23 by THE ACTOR AT WORK presented by the Old Tote Theatre Company. Although these programmes are obviously ideally suited to young audiences there is equal value and entertainment for the adult audience (where else would one see a full act of LA FILLE MAL GARDEE with the Australian Ballet and the Elizabethan Orchestra, plus insights into rehearsals and classes for \$1.50?). For
