MESSAGE OF GOOD WISHES FROM THE QUEEN

The Trust was founded and named in 1954, the year of The Queen's first visit to Australia, in the hope that the new Elizabethan age in Australia would see a similar flowering of the arts as the first Elizabethan age had seen in England in the sixteenth century; hence our name "Elizabethan".

When The Queen was advised that the Trust had emerged from provisional liquidation, a message in reply sent through The Queen's Assistant Private Secretary has been received. The reply of 29th October read in part:

BUCKINGHAM PALACE

"I have laid the new chairman's letter before The Queen who was pleased to hear that the Trust's financial problems have been resolved and that the Trust is fully active again.

"I should be grateful if you could pass on Her Majesty's good wishes to the Chairman and Directors of the Trust for the future.

BUSINESS BOOMS AT THE TRUST
